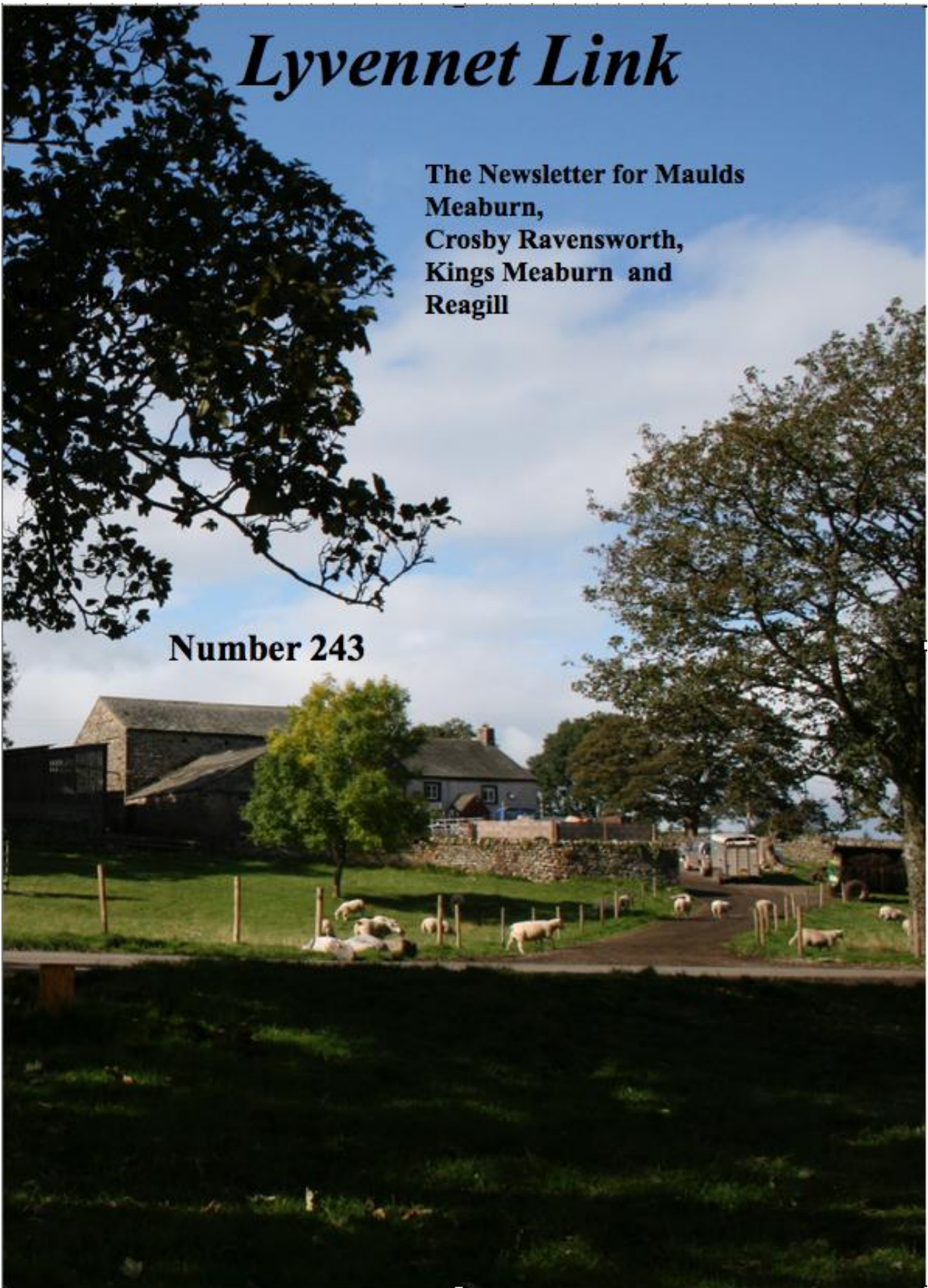

## **NEWS FROM CROSBY RAVENSWORTH C OF E SCHOOL.**

Well it's been a busy start to the summer term. Class 2 got the fantastic opportunity of an animation masterclass from Virpi of Kettu Studios. Virpi has been involved previously with the creation of 'Wallace & Gromit', 'Shaun the Sheep' and that loveable penguin 'Pingu'. Working together they came up with their own animated story 'The Ancient Mayan tale of Pacal and the Beanstalk' which can be viewed via our school's facebook page. The children all enjoyed working on this project.

Talking of projects, we would encourage you to visit Rheged between now and July and take a look at the 'Epona the Wild Pony of the North' display. The huge display introduces an ambitious new project involving the concept of a giant fell pony on the side of Blease Fell in the Tebay Gorge area. The display features some of the work produced by our own pupils in earlier workshops, namely the Fell Pony maquettes they made.

Class 2 has also welcomed Mr Tinkler, a student teacher (as part of his postgraduate certificate in education) who, over the forthcoming weeks, will be working closely with our experienced teaching staff, gaining valuable experience in the classroom and contributing to the vibrant learning environment we strive to create.

Reception and Years 1 and 2 have enjoyed a visit to Carlisle Castle and Cathedral.

Looking ahead to this month, years 4-6 will be attending an orienteering workshop at Morland Primary School. There is also an upcoming Raga Workshop for our class 2 pupils. This unique opportunity will introduce our young musicians to the rich tradition of Indian classical music, focusing on the intricate melodies and rhythms of ragas. On the sporting front, class 2 are also due to take part in the annual Long Marton Shield, involving netball and football.

And forever hopeful that drier, sunnier weather is on its way we are excited to confirm that our annual sponsored walk will take place on Friday 24th May. As usual, this is a fundraising event and so if you are asked by one of the children as family, friend or neighbour to sponsor them, we thank you in advance for your support. Children in Class 2 have been asked, as homework, to consider which charitable cause the school should share the proceeds with and prepare a one minute speech to persuade others in a future class discussion.
